The Southern Regional Children’s Advocacy Center is working in collaboration with Duke University’s Evidence-based Practice Implementation Center (EPIC) to offer TF-CBT training, through an innovative Learning Collaborative* process, for therapists who provide services to Children’s Advocacy Centers. The learning collaborative will include three, two day learning sessions, one every 3-4 months, plus monthly conference calls. In order to participate, the CAC administrator, a clinical supervisor and the therapists must participate.

CORE TRAINING INFORMATION

Southern Regional provides Core Trainings each year to CAC staff and multidisciplinary team members. All sessions are held in Huntsville, Alabama on the campus of the National Children's Advocacy Center.



Frequently Asked Questions:

Who is the target audience?

A. Each session is designed to enhance the skills of the CAC staff and multidisciplinary team members.

Can I attend if I am not in the southern region?

A. Yes. Sessions are open to CAC staff and multidisciplinary team members outside of the southern region. However, some of these trainings are available from your Regional CAC as well.

Is hotel and travel included in the tuition?

A. Tuition covers lunch meals and materials, lodging and travel are the responsibility of the attendee. Lodging is coordinated at the government per diem rate. Tuition and travel assistance may be available from your Regional CAC.

CAC MANAGEMENT

April 19—22

This training is designed to meet the specialized training needs of individuals who have primary responsibility for the day-to-day operation of a Children's Advocacy Center. The course is primarily geared to address the needs of newer CAC directors, but would also be beneficial to those with more experience who are seeking to enhance their management skills. Topics to be covered include strategic planning; grant writing; fund raising; financial management; legal issues; personnel policies; risk management; marketing/community relations; interagency partnerships; media responses and more.

TEAM FACILITATOR

May 25—27

This training is for Children's Advocacy Center staff/multidisciplinary team members wishing to enhance their skills as facilitators of team meetings as well as ongoing team communication and relationships. The three-day session will provide individuals charged with the responsibility for facilitation of their local multidisciplinary team with specific skills intended to enhance participatory discussion that involves all team members. In addition, the session will provide insight into strategies for identifying system issues that impact cases and team dynamics as well as helping to promote collaborative decision-making and healthy, productive methods for addressing conflict.

MULTIDISCIPLINARY TEAM DEVELOPMENT

September 28—October 1; November 19—22

This **tuition-free** training is specifically designed for multidisciplinary teams affiliated with a CAC and who wish to develop and enhance team skills and relationships. In this course participants will learn how to develop trust and teamwork; nurture team identity and commitment; help your team solve problems and make decisions; manage conflict and resolve differences; enhance investigative strategies and team operation.

ACCREDITATION BOOT CAMP

October 18—19

This training is for CACs who are applying for accreditation and re-evaluation and have not already submitted their application to the National Children's Alliance but plan to do so by April 2009 or later. The two-day Boot Camp focuses on understanding the accreditation process; NCA standards; the accreditation packet; and preparing for the site visit.

MEDICAL TRAINING ACADEMY

November 4—6

This training is designed specifically for health care providers who have the responsibility for providing the medical evaluation for children who are suspected victims of child abuse. This training is appropriate for physicians, nurse practitioners, SANE nurses, or other registered nurses with advanced training, and physician's assistants with less than 2 years of experience in this area of health care. **This training is not intended for nurses or other health care providers whose role is to assist an examiner.** CME credits are coordinated for this training.
