- 2. Access to the *Journal and Book Finder* collection of over 1,500 scholarly journals and books. *CALiO*TM*SuperSearch* and the *Special Collections* is limited to Children's Advocacy Center staffs and Multidisciplinary Teams.

Search strategy tips

- 1. Think synonyms Example: perpetrator OR offender
- 2. Truncation- Add* after root word to search all forms -Example: interview*
- 3. Use " " for phrases- Example: "child sexual abuse"
- 4. Narrow searches by dates, publication types, or authors
- 5. Ask a librarian
